SENATOR BEUTLER: Can I have a Call of the House, Mr. Speaker?

SENATOR NICHOL: You have enough votes, sir. Okay, excuse me, Senator Beutler, I was incorrect. I thought mine was in addition to that, so yes, you may have a roll call...a roll call and a Call of the House, and we will vote now for a Call of the House. I'm sorry I misinformed you.

CLERK: Senator Nichol voting aye.

SENATOR NICHOL: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 2 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR NICHOL: We are under Call. Will those who are not in their seats, please go to their seats? Will the Sergeant at Arms please round up those who are absent and bring them back to the Legislature? Will you please record your presence? Senator Marsh and Senator Labeledz are the only two not...that are excused. Senator Beutler, please record your presence. Senator Keyes, please record your presence. No, you didn't need to talk, just record your presence. Thank you. Senator Kahle. Senator Hoagland. Senator Newell. They are all accounted for now, and Senator Beutler, you wanted a roll call vote? Is that correct? You wanted a roll call vote, Senator Beutler?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, sir.

SENATOR NICHOL: Okay, we'll have a roll call vote.
