SPEAKER MARVEL: Now, Senator DeCamp, you are speaking on what motion? Are you speaking on the adoption of.... Well the motion technically is to bring 316 back for specific amendment. Do you have more than one specific amendment?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Okay, Mr. President, once again since some people did not catch it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Senator Dworak....

SENATOR DeCAMP: A few technical amendments. They are on one page. That is being handed out. The white copy you have received is what we traditionally do on a complicated bill so you don't have to juggle around. It gives you the bill as it has been amended up to this point so you can read the whole thing without juggling back and forth into three or four bills. The amendments themselves, as I say,
