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I agree with Senator DeCamp. I think that this is a little more controversial than Senator Newell thinks it is. I first off have a question of Senator Newell.

PRESIDENT: Senator Newell, will you respond?

SENATOR NEWELL: Yes, I will, Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Are you familiar with the deregulation that has taken place in the airline industry?

SENATOR NEWELL: Yes, I am.

SENATOR WESELY: How was that decision made?

SENATOR NEWELL: That was made by legislation, Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: That was made by legislation?

SENATOR NEWELL: That is right. That is correct.

SENATOR WESELY: I assumed that it was the ICC that did that and I think the trucking deregulation matter is a little more important than just passing this resolution so I think we ought to give it a little time to look at it. No need to be hasty even on a legislative resolution.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol. Senator Nichol, do you wish to speak to the....all right, the Chair recognizes Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I don't want to get involved in this issue between Senator DeCamp and Senator Newell but I would like to ask Senator DeCamp one question.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp, will you respond?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Does it have anything to do with China?

SENATOR LEWIS: No, it certainly doesn't, but the question I was going to ask, does this have anything to do with the fact that yesterday Senator Newell was chairing a committee that you appeared before with a meritorious piece of legislation?

SENATOR DeCAMP: No, absolutely not. Senator Newell and I had a good day yesterday.

SENATOR NEWELL: Now watch yourself, John.
