SENATOR KEYES: Lieutenant Governor Luedtke, how many are excused today?

PRESIDENT: There were nine. I don't know if that is still true or not.

SENATOR KEYES: Nine. Would it be possible to get some of them in here?

PRESIDENT: Nine is correct.

SENATOR KEYES: Would it be possible to have some of them come back or else adjourn until they are all here?

PRESIDENT: It is possible to adjourn anytime you make a motion I guess.

SENATOR KEYES: You may have that motion very suddenly if we don't get enough people here.

PRESIDENT: Senator Newell and Senator Warner are the only ones I believe that have not checked in. Otherwise, everyone else is excused. Senator Schmit, would you care to wait until they get here.

SENATOR SCHMIT: If you could find them, Mr. President, otherwise we will have roll call.

PRESIDENT: All right. We will have Senator Warner and Senator Newell. We will wait for them to get here. Senator Warner is on his way. If the Sergeant at Arms could find Senator Newell, we would be ready to proceed with the roll call vote. Here is Senator Newell so when Senator Warner gets here we will proceed then. Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Why don't you go ahead, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We will proceed with the roll call vote because Senator Warner is at the end of the roll call anyway. Mr. Clerk, you will proceed then with the roll call vote.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See pages 831 and 832, Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to indefinitely postpone.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The bill is indefinitely postponed. We will proceed then with LB 36 on General File. You may read something in. Speaker Marvel, do you want to come up here?
