SENATOR COPE: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Dworak. Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: A question of Senator DeCamp.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp, do you yield to a question?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes.

SENATOR VICKERS: Senator DeCamp, as I read this bill, this also means that the magnetic in coding has to have the account number of the maker, is that correct?

SENATOR DeCAMP: The maker and the federal reserve district. As I understand, the routing...

SENATOR VICKERS: Are you aware of how many banks in this state that may not have the account numbers on a computerized system at this point in time?

SENATOR DeCAMP: No, I am not. As I say, this was brought in by the Nebraska Bankers. We understood it had the support of the banking community. It was only later that we heard there were some individual banks that might have some opposition. I contacted the man that had called me, the individual banker that said he had some concerns, told him if they did have any concerns, get me information, get which banks were opposed, get all this information to me. I have heard nothing further from them. I contacted Mr. Brandt and I see I have a note. I would like to speak to Senator DeCamp, Bill Brandt. I have heard nothing more from him. I brought up the issue to him and he said he wasn't aware of any opposition or any problem. But as I say, I think we should adopt the committee amendments for sure and then we can get on to whether you want the other. That will give me time to run back and find out what he wants, if that is okay.

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 269. All those in favor of those amendments vote aye, opposed vote no. Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the committee amendments.
