LB 269, 65

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Hasebroock, do you want to advance LB 269 as amended?

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, I move that LB 269 be advanced to E & R initial. I think it has been pretty well explained. John, do you have some more, Senator DeCamp, some explanation? I will turn it over to you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: It will not eliminate counter checks within a city, within a community. It would eliminate a counter check going from Hastings to Grand Island, as I understand it. It would require either the name of the maker, which you could put on right there, or the magnetic encoding of the maker's magnetic symbol. So answer, it would not eliminate counter checks within that community or within that area.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance the bill to E & R for review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no with the committee amendments adopted. We are voting on the advancement of LB 269 to E & R for review. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We have time for a couple more bills. Senator Keyes, LB 65 is in your name. Do you wish to discuss the bill?

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, I don't know how LB 65 got in my name. It is a bill that is a result of a resolution last year to study codifying the homestead exemption laws and Senator Newell is Chairman of that and Senator Cal Carsten is Chairman of the Revenue Committee. So I really see no reason for my name being on the bill except that I am going to support it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: It is a Revenue Committee bill. The Chair recognizes Senator Newell. I am sorry. The Clerk will read the title.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 65. Title read. The bill was read for the first time on January 4. It was referred to the Revenue Committee. It was advanced to General File.
