SENATOR KELLY: It may be that it would be preferable for you and I to enter a bill in next session to cause just that to happen.

SENATOR NEWELL: Well, before Senator DeCamp gets away, I'm wondering if Senator DeCamp also feels that this is such an important resolution that it ought to...

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp, would you respond to this question? We can't hear what your two hands said, so...

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, of course, my specialty is trucking resolutions and I haven't read this one and so I can't say that this is or isn't.

SENATOR NEWELL: Well, if Senator DeCamp really has no objection, since I am a cosponsor of the Kelly resolution, maybe I should let...and Ralph next time will you give me the right answer? That was the wrong answer on that. I will remove my objections. I think we can vote on this now. I...there's a principle here that I wanted to establish, but since there is no great overwhelming desire to refer this to a committee, I'll just drop that. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Kelly for purposes of closing on his resolution.

SENATOR KELLY: My closing, Mr. President, would be to draw specific attention to Senator Newell that the number of this resolution is 21.

PRESIDENT: With that we will...the motion before the House is the adoption of LR 21. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Resolution 21...LR 21 is passed, the motion carries, and the resolution is passed. We will then proceed to Agenda Item 8, Select File, LR 26.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are E & R amendments to LB 26 pending.
