SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I think the point that...I move for the adoption of the amendment first, Mr. President. I think the point that Senator Keyes raised is a valid point. I've been in counsel with a couple of other senators here, and this is a definite dealing with the...with the lid bill, the LB 1 that we passed and it certainly does not...should not be a part of this bill at all. In light of that, and in light of the fact that we're dealing with some clarifications of LB 1 in amendments that will be held for a public hearing on Friday, it is only proper, I believe, that this section should be removed from this bill. It's on that basis that I make this move, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is to strike, what...it's Section 11 of what, the...

CLERK: Of the Schmit-Cullan amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the original amendment. Now let's see. Senator Vickers, do you wish to speak to that, to the Carsten amendment? Your light is on. Do you wish to speak to the Carsten amendment?
