

Senator Labeledz and Senator Venditte, Senator Dworak and others would be willing to do this same thing because that is the only way we can serve the public. Those who have strong feelings, those who have no feelings and those who also have equal concerns on the other side, I ask for you to look at this seriously and to bring the bill back. Let's make the amendments but let's make them all. If we do not, I will not support the bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President and colleagues, my understanding that is exactly what Senator DeCamp is asking us to do at this point is to bring the bill back and make these two corrective amendments. Now whether Senator DeCamp gets the credit for it, Senator Chambers gets the credit for it, I could care less. I, like you, Senator Koch, want the strongest most accurate bill possible. I have worked very hard to get that. I have spent a lot of hours with it. I do not have a legal background. I have to rely on other opinions in these areas. I have tried to get opinions on both sides of this. I have worked with Senator Johnson, with Senator Hoagland, Senator DeCamp and anyone else that was willing to sit down and spend some extra hours on this. I have listened to Senator Chambers and I vote with Senator Chambers a lot on other issues. I think the points he raised are valid. I think Senator Chambers has done a good job in this particular area. I think the bill now with the amendments that Senator DeCamp, Senator Johnson and myself are offering, make it a sound bill. I think the bill probably would have passed without the amendments, but I think in an effort to be as proper and as correct and as right as humanly possible, we need to bring it back. My ego doesn't get involved in my efforts as much as some other Senators on this floor. I am willing to say that if, in fact, these amendments need to be made now, let's make them. I think the amendments will correct what questions there are left. Now whether you ever get to the point that you have a totally constitutional document, I don't know. I think you can take any bill this Legislature passes and you can put a hundred attorneys in a room and come up with a hundred different opinions on any bill regardless what the subject matter is. Now we are talking about an area that is very delicate. We are talking about an area that is fluid. We are talking about an area where we have a court's litigation constantly altering the positions we
