If you really want to get technical you could cause your neighbor all kinds of trouble if you wanted to just for aggravation and I think that we need to get something on the books that gives us guidance in whether a domestic well can actually stop an irrigator or vice versa so, I would hope we wouldn't pull back. I respect Senator Kremer's judgment but I think any bill that he has brought up this year concerning water that we have torn him to pieces on it. I think he is about ready to give up and I do think that we should go on and try to work this out and, goodness sakes, we have made mistakes before. If there is something wrong with it we can surely fix it.
