LB 377

Guggenmos. Will you indicate your presence by raising your hand so we can welcome you? Now, Mr. Clerk, we go to LB 377.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 377. Title read. The bill was first read on January 17. It was referred to the Judiciary Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by Senator Nichol's committee, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you move the adoption of the committee amendment?

SENATOR NICHOL: Yes, sir. Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, the selling price, LB 377 has to do with the selling price of bound volumes of the decisions of the Nebraska Supreme Court. We will first take up the committee amendments. These amendments were brought to us by Mr. James E. Dunlevey, Court Administrator, who appeared on behalf of the Supreme Court. The bill itself deals with the sale of the bound volumes of the Nebraska Supreme Court decisions. The amendment allows for the microfilming and the sale of such microfilm of these reports. The reason for the need for microfilming and the sale of this microfilm is that the supply of the early bound volumes of the Supreme Court decisions is now exhausted. The microfilm reproduction would be an economical alternative. In addition libraries in some of the larger law firms are making increasing use of the microfilm as the price of book increases and the shelf space becomes an increasing problem. I move for the adoption of the committee amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Keyes, do you wish to speak on the committee amendments or on the bill as a whole?

SENATOR KEYES: On the bill as a whole.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, first of all, we are voting on the adoption of the Judiciary Committee amendments to LB 377. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. We are voting on committee amendments to LB 377. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried and the amendments are adopted. Now, Senator Nichol.
