SENATOR LEWIS: One minute, Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: But now we are combining the two under one entity and that is an escape, so to speak, for this particular mortician to preneed solicit.

SENATOR WESELY: Could I respond to that?

SENATOR DWORAK: Yes, please.

SENATOR WESELY: I think that the only way that that would be possible under the amendment that we have would be if you purchase a plot in a cemetery that was owned then by a funeral home and then because you were going to that cemetery you felt a need to go to the funeral home that owned it. That would be the only way. Otherwise they still could not overtly solicit.

SENATOR LEWIS: Time is up.

SENATOR DWORAK: Thank you.

SENATOR LEWIS: Senator Johnson, to the Wesely amendment.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Yes, I have a couple of questions of Senator Wesely, if he would yield?

SENATOR WESELY: I don't know.

SENATOR JOHNSON: That is a fair response. Senator Wesely, the second part of your amendment would apparently change subsection (p) on page 19 of the bill, is that correct?

SENATOR WESELY: Subsection (p). (i) and (p), that is what would be changed.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Yes, you are changing (i) and (p). I only want to speak to the (p) section.

SENATOR WESELY: You can do that anytime you want.

SENATOR LEWIS: Shall we get to the issue at hand here?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Okay, the question is this, as I read subsection (p) right now it says simply that a licensee or an applicant may not contract with any other organization to supply goods pursuant to preneed solicitation, is that correct?
