I think it took the wrong sort of approach to the problem but there is a problem and there was some consideration and some concern that maybe the problem had been solved in the past, that we didn't really need this sort of legislation, and let's face it. In the past we have had serious problems with all kinds of bizarre and extended advertising that really wasn't necessary and I think that that problem is not as great as it was in the past but I think that there is still problems so I think we need LB 458. I think it is going to have to be amended but I would encourage you to vote to reconsider. Thank you.
