CLERK: Senator Cullan voting aye. Senator Frank Lewis voting aye. Senator Reutzel voting aye. Senator Labeledz voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We are voting on the Vickers motion in regard to LB 458. All legislators are to be in their seats. Unauthorized personnel is to leave the floor. Who is excused?

CLERK: Senator Kremer voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Call is raised. The Clerk will announce the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 7 nays, Mr. President.
