businesses polled a support position to a corporate alien ownership act protecting the family farm in the State of Nebraska. They realize in our rural areas that when the family farm goes and is replaced by the corporation, the large type corporation, it buys wholesale and bypasses the small businesses of the state. Their survival is directly dependent upon the family farm structure. Each time additional family farm units are wiped out, we add more people to the employment picture and to the unemployment rolls, whether it be the farmer that has moved off, or the working person that is replaced by this. I am not professing that this takes care of the price problems of agriculture, the cheap grain prices, or anything like this, but it is an issue that's a state issue where we can directly prohibit aliens through the corporate system and the large multi-national corporations from invading and taking over, or substantially invading agriculture. The integrated corporation, the processing corporation, does not have to compete fairly with the family farm unit. The family farm unit is the most efficient production unit, but has been a very inefficient pricing unit in agriculture. Family farms have taken the prices handed down to them through either combination of government action, or the multi-national corporations that control most of our purchases of farm products. So we are in the squeeze. If allowed to continue through the corporate system, aliens have the potential of coming in, buying farm land, paying virtually no state taxes, as they can ship the raw materials produced, the grain and the livestock overseas, sell it at prices that reflect no income in this nation, and therefore, pay no income taxes. Aliens are advantaged under our tax laws, and these are by treaties, and the only way of stopping this is by direct prohibition of their continuance in agriculture. I wish you would look over the handouts I have passed out. We have a lot of information on the national scene in what is happening in agriculture today. Some say a fraction of one percent, and some say as high as two or more percent...two percent of the land in this country currently owned by aliens, or nonresident aliens, people from countries outside this nation that do not have to obey the laws of this nation. Two percent of the farm land in the United States is the equivalent of one state already gone. I am sure that had Florida been taken over by Cuba everyone in the country would be up in arms in a hurry, but to allow our basic farm land, our renewable resources to be sold and go out of the hands of the people in this country, I think is totally inexcusable...any portion of it, whether it be large or not. There is currently an ad running in the Nebraska Farmer involving expected...or offering to purchase by foreign owners in volume and the threat is here. At this point, we can pass a law without disrupting the economic activity. We have grandfathered out in the bill the poultry industry, which I feel is already gone. I feel the
