LB 94, 379

Senator Cullan, do you want to proceed with the roll call?

SENATOR CULLAN: Yes, call the roll.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the roll call is on LB 94, and its advancement from General File to E & R for Review. The Clerk will call the roll. All legislators must be in their seats. Senator Merz, will you please...are all legislators now in their seats? Okay. We need your cooperation to stay in your seats during the roll call. Call the roll, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President. (Roll call vote may be found on Page 936 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion fails. The Call is raised. Before we go to the next business, underneath the south balcony, it's my privilege to present to you Mr. Carl Spelts who is a friend of both Senator Cope and Senator Kahle. Carl, we're happy to have you with us. Stand up and be recognized.

The Chair recognizes...Mr. Clerk, we're going to take up one more bill before we quit and that's 379. Do you have any amendments on 379?

CLERK: (Read LB 379.) The bill was read on January 17. It was referred to the Constitutional Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are Committee amendments by Senator Reutzel's Constitutional Revision and Recreation Committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I move the adoption of the Committee amendments? The amendments simply clarify the language by deleting references which have reference to specific officers and allows the court to appoint officers and employees as they deem necessary, much as the Legislature does. I move the adoption of the amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Committee amendments to LB 379. All those in favor aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? We're voting on the adoption of the Committee amendments to LB 379. Have you all voted? We're voting on the Committee amendments to 379. Clerk record the vote.
