SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Chairman, I don't fit in and this is a little much, but I just have a short amendment. I would simply... I think it is fine to have a Czech Day, really, but I would like to amend the resolution to change it to February 29th if possible.

PRESIDENT: Now do you want to withdraw that?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, all right.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely, would you care to...?

SENATOR WESELY: All I wanted to say was I think Senator Lewischek is a little out of line on this. We don't need to refer this.

PRESIDENT: I'm sorry but we have to take up the amendment to...this is to refer to the committee which is the Executive Board. Would you care to close, Senator Lewis? Senator Maresh, did you wish to speak to the amendment?

SENATOR MARESH: I oppose the motion. I feel this is no problem to get this solved today and I hope that the members vote against this. As far as bringing something, I thought if I would bring kolaches today that would sort of be trying to buy votes so...I can't promise but I can hint that there will be kolaches some day.
