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see by the General File listing up there that we are going to have to move on some General File bills or there will be nothing for E & R to do downstairs and we will simply clog up the process, so I would urge you today and over the weekend to read the consent calendar which, first of all, lists bills which were advanced to General File with no dissenting votes and no committee amendments, and, secondly, bills which were advanced to General File with no dissenting votes and with committee amendments attached. There are two or three of you who have already indicated the fact that some bills were left off and these will be put on because they qualify under the two listings that we have on the sheet. There may be some other problems and I urge you to check them over and send our office whatever comments you have. You will note at the bottom of the sheet and in this regard we need particular cooperation from members of the Legislature. The function of a consent calendar is to attempt to process legislation and we are going to try this every afternoon, Monday through Thursday of next week because some of the committees are still out, and hopefully we will have at least 25 people who can be here to begin to process this legislation, but if some of you disagree with the listing of these bills, then you can see the rules at the bottom of the page which indicate that three members who object and your objection must be in writing to the office, and incidentally those objections are available to anyone that wants to see them, but you need to advise us if three of you object to any of these listings and secondly, you will see down there if the debate extends fifteen minutes, then the bill will be removed from the consent calendar and any time that you remove a bill from the consent calendar, then it goes to the bottom of the calendar for the next day. Now some of you can do irreparable damage to some of the bills, so I suggest that you look at this carefully and in the spirit of cooperation, let's attempt to try to process as many of these bills as we can in the next few days or we are going to be bogged down as far as the Legislature is concerned. Now, Mr. President, I don't know, does anybody have any questions at this time?

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. Speaker, I think it is an excellent idea but I think the point needs to be reiterated that the Speaker made. We went through this once or twice before that just for the purpose of removing a bill for some other than the legitimate purposes of the bill, some people started removing those as I recall, and at one time
