is then in the next...oh, down to about line 8, the second 8 in the process, so that it specified how it takes place in a class one district and this is satisfactory with the Secretary of State's office. It requires considerable more signatures actually to get a recall because it calls for 25% of the voters, the registered voters in the district, and of course many of our class one districts don't have that kind of turnout at school meetings. So we think it is a good approach and it has been researched and so I would advise you to support the adoption of the amendment. Thank you.
