SENATOR KOCH: That is correct and the reason for that is because these kind of procedures must be published in the newspaper and I want to make certain that it is a legal newspaper. That is the intent of putting that word in there so it makes sure it is a legal newspaper. I ask for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell, did you want to speak to the Koch amendments or did you want to speak to the bill as a whole?

SENATOR NEWELL: I want to speak to the bill but I would call the question on this if it is necessary. Is there any other lights?

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of the Koch amendment as read vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the Koch amendment to LB 125. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Koch's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the amendment is adopted. Any other amendments?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Stoney moves to amend and his amendments are on page 750 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, as you all know we in the City of Omaha have district election of our school board members. LB 125 as written did not distinguish with reference to recall whether or not those individuals would be subjected by the district in totality or the subdistrict in which they were elected. Now the amendment that I offer is an amendment of clarification. It provides that those individuals subject to recall would be subject only in those subdistricts in which they were elected and I would move for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there any other discussion? All those in favor of the Stoney amendment to LB 125 vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Stoney's amendment.
