SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Kelly, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR KELLY: A question of Senator Beutler regarding his amendment and I would state the question to you, Mr. Chairman, and you can see what you want to do with it. Senator Nichol told me that the reason we have fourteen and fifteen, fourteen for a school permit, fifteen for a learner's permit is that if they live through that year, they will be able to learn quite well. Is that correct?

SENATOR BEUTLER: You don't really expect an answer to that question, Senator Kelly.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler, do you wish to close on the motion to adopt the committee amendments?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I have no further comments, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 23. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The amendments are adopted. We will leave 23...

SENATOR MERZ: Please, I can't be here Monday.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I am sorry, sir, but we have some amendments and there is nothing we can do at the moment.

SENATOR MERZ: No, we don't.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Pardon?

SENATOR MERZ: No amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You have no amendments?

SENATOR MERZ: No.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. The Chair recognizes Senator Merz. I thought there were about three or four amendments.

SENATOR MERZ: Mr. President, in the manner of time I would request that we move the bill and I appreciate your help.
