You met, a while ago, Dr. Jim Williams from the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources, and he has now developed a new variety of soybean that will be a great help to the soybean producers of Nebraska. You will recall also, that Senator Maresh worked diligently on this bill, and patiently I might add, and sometimes a little bit frustrated, but he stayed with it and we did get the bill, and as a result of this, the Nebraska Legislature has assisted the soybean producers to help themselves by this kind of financing. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, if Senator Rumery would allow me just a second, please to tag onto what he has said, I appreciate what Senator Maresh has done, and Dr. Williams, Dr. Massengale, and others, in working with these soybeans. Later in the session I'll have a little bill in called LB 14, which has to do with dry edible beans, attempting to do the same thing, and some of these same people, if it's allowed, will be working on the same thing. I received a letter this morning from a gentleman in Alliance, who already has a mold in his dry edible beans that he would like to have them work on. So, I compliment Senator Rumery and Senator Maresh on what they have done in the past.

PRESIDENT: Thank you for that commercial on dry edible beans. Alright, anything else, Mr. Speaker? I guess we will proceed then, ready for Final Reading. Ready for Agenda Item #5, Final Reading. The Sergeant at Arms will make certain that all aisles are cleared, that all nonlegislative personnel is off the floor, and all members are at their desks. We will proceed then with Final Reading. While we're doing that, the Clerk may read in some matters into the record.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Constitutional Revision and Recreation whose Chairman is Senator Reutzel to whom we referred LB 493 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation that it be advanced to General File with amendments. Signed Senator Reutzel.
