PRESIDENT: The Chair would like to recognize the following visitors from Milligan, Senator Maresh's district... CLERK: Mr. President there are E & R amendments to LB 435.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Reutzel.

CLERK: 812?

SENATOR REUTZEL: The amendments are on 812.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Reutzel now offers amendments found on Page 812 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Mr. President and members of the body, these are the amendments that I passed out last week in anticipation of getting to 435 and we never did. 435 had 4 or 5 votes against it on General File, and there was a lot of discussion about a rhetoric. I think everyone received a letter from, I believe, the Niobrara Sportsmans Club saying that the NRA was in opposition to this, etc., etc. I called Senator Gary Anderson, and I'm sure all of you...or some you, at least, remember Senator Anderson
