SENATOR KEYES: There is no limit on the time on it then?

SENATOR KREMER: Not that I know of.

SENATOR KEYES: I wish there was some way we could put one on there, Senator Kremer. When you have seen a man die of getting exposed to ammonia, it is a horrible death.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: A question of Senator Kremer, if he would yield.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KOCH: Senator Kremer, when you talk about the committee amendments, could you go through it again for me. I am sorry. I missed it. Are you striking 65 and putting 250 in there?

SENATOR KREMER: Senator Koch, the committee amendments, this is my amendment, Senator Koch, we are talking about.

SENATOR KOCH: All right.

SENATOR KREMER: It is not a committee amendment.

SENATOR KOCH: Oh, your amendment.

SENATOR KREMER: What we are doing here, Senator Koch, we are requiring the larger tanks, that is the transport tanks, that carry over 3,000 gallons, they have to be built to the specification of 265 pounds rather than 250 as provided by the bill. We think these larger tanks should be built heavier because they actually are on the highway. They very well could burst, you know, and cause a lot of problems. We think they should be heavier.

SENATOR KOCH: What you are doing then is you are prescribing a more strict measure than we presently have, is that correct?

SENATOR KREMER: No, the bill brought them down to 250. We want them left at 265.

SENATOR KOCH: Okay, fine, thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Kremer amendment to LB 476. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.
