CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, Senator Duis asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 412; Senator Koch to LB 58.

Mr. President, your committee on Urban Affairs whose Chairman is Senator George to whom we referred LB 181 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File with amendments. Signed Senator George, Chairman.

Mr. President, your committee on Business and Labor whose Chairman is Senator Maresh to whom was referred LB 444 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File with amendments. Signed Senator Maresh.

Mr. President, a new resolution, LR 32. Read. (See page 1000, Legislative Journal.) That will properly be laid over, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I want to thank you again for your patience and cooperation. We will do this again tomorrow afternoon. Senator Wagner, do you want to move that we adjourn until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock?
