SENATOR KOCH: Madam Chairman, I assume I need 25 votes so I am going to have to ask for a Call of the House and hopefully I can pick up those five. Thank you.

SENATOR MARSH: A call for a Call for the House has been made. Please register your vote. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR MARSH: The House is under Call. Please return to your seats and register your presence.

CLERK: May I accept votes?

SENATOR MARSH: Yes.

CLERK: Senator Newell voting aye; Senator Fowler voting aye; Senator Lewis voting aye; Senator Fitzgerald voting aye; Senator Simon voting aye.

SENATOR MARSH: The Call may be raised.

SENATOR KOCH: Thank you.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Koch's amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR KOCH: Madam Chairman, I have another amendment up there and I would ask that that amendment be withdrawn.

It is redundant at the present time.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you. Is there an objection? It is withdrawn. Senator Venditte. Excuse me, Senator Chambers' are ahead of you, excuse me.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Clerk, could you read this amendment because I am...

CLERK: I have two, Senator. I am not sure which one you want to... The first one that you gave us was to amend the Koch amendment: Strike all of lines 9 and 11.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Has he offered that amendment which this one would amend because it didn't sound like what he just addressed was the amendment that I thought was coming up?

CLERK: I don't think so but maybe you should visit with him but I don't think so.
