SENATOR SIMON: Yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, all right. The motion is the adoption of the specific amendment of Senator Simon to LB 425. Senator Lamb, for what purpose do you arise? I am sorry. I recognize you.

SENATOR LAMB: Point of order, Mr. Chairman. I am wondering. Senator Simon also has an amendment to his amendment which is on 912 which makes that total amendment acceptable and I am wondering what the procedure is in order to incorporate this amendment at this stage?

SPEAKER MARVEL: If I understand the proposition, the bill was returned for a specific amendment. We are in the process of adopting that specific amendment. If it gets 25 votes it will be adopted. Then the bill must return, must be advanced and then brought back for another specific amendment. Okay, we are voting on the Simon amendment to LB 425. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is on the Simon specific amendment which is found on what page, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: 848, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Page 848. The Simon amendment to LB 425 for which the bill was returned is on page 848 of the Journal. We are now voting on the adoption of that amendment. Have you all voted? The Chair will call for the vote once more. The Legislature voted to return LB 425 for a specific amendment. The vote now is on that specific amendment. Have you all voted? No, you can't, you can't... You have to record your vote yourself. The Chair will not accept votes called in. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the amendment is adopted. Now the bill must be returned. Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Simon a couple of questions before we return it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well now, excuse me. First of all we need to advance the bill.
