SENATOR MURPHY: They have gone from seventy-five to eighty-five percent?

SENATOR KAHLE: Correct, and that's the reason for the change in the percentage. I just spoke to Mr. Drain. I don't think there's any secret about it, and it's actually going to cost the state less for these projects than it has in the past.

SENATOR KEYES: And we're supporting increasing the federal government's deficit spending then, am I to be led to believe?

SENATOR KAHLE: Well, I don't know whether we are. We're contributing to the delinquency of a minor I expect.

SENATOR KEYES: Ah ha...just so that we remember that when we sign one of those petitions that we want to keep the federal government from going in debt and telling them what to do. That's all.
