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disallow those individuals who apply for unemployment benefits, and I think that within the framework provided here, that we should perhaps concentrate some of our efforts on the Department of Labor, and insist that those individuals who do secure unemployment compensation do qualify on the basis of actually having lost their job. Otherwise, I think that it says in here that it's pretty well been decided and whether we like it or not, and there are those of us, of course, that do not, think that it might be somewhat out of line, but nonetheless that decision has been made already, and it's been made way in the past a long time before most of us were here that there's going to be such a thing as unemployment compensation, and I would have to perhaps agree with some of my other friends on the labor side that the ten dollar increase is not a substantial increase, and then expect that we carry the contest to the Labor Commissioner and expect him to rule so that those individuals who deserve unemployment compensation receive it, and those who do not are disallowed, because that's where the real right is.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I am to blame. There is confusion as to what is really in the bill, so I will tell you. You see, because Senator Brennan is carrying the bill, and he is head of the AFL - CIO, that makes certain people suspicious. What, in fact, occurred was the Nebraska Association of Commerce and Industry introduced a bill on this subject. I thought it would be kind of interesting to have Brennan carrying Industry's bill, so I merely gutted Brennan's bill and put the Commerce and Industry bill in it. So Brennan is chairing Nebraska Association of Commerce and Industry's bill. Now he doesn't particularly like it, but he thinks that's all he's going to get, and he's willing to accept that. So let me clarify one more time, the bill, as it's amended, once you've adopted the Committee amendments, is a Nebraska Association of Commerce and Industry proposal that they had introduced in the Legislature. So I would urge you to support it, understanding that the head of the of the AFL-CIO and Business have now had a merger.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I didn't know that, and that's big news to me that Mr. McNery and Mr. Brennan have joined forces. Now I'm sure that the state of Nebraska will certainly move forward. I think there's some difference here, Senator Brennan, in this bill
