SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Dworak, do you want to be recognized?

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. Speaker, I call for the question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? Okay, the question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. The Clerk has got some items to read in and then we'll go to Senator Landis and LB 447.
