LB 428A introduced by Senator Cullan. (Read by title for the first time LB 428A. See Page 1017 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, your Committee on Public Works whose Chairman is Senator Kremer to whom we referred LB 284 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation that it be advanced to General File with amendments, and LB 270 indefinitely postponed. Signed, Senator Kremer.

Mr. President, Senator Marsh asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 80, and I have an Attorney General's opinion addressed to Senator Cullan regarding LB 298, which will be inserted in the Legislative Journal. (See Pages 1019 and 1020 of the Legislative Journal.)

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 447 was a bill introduced by the... by Senator David Landis. (Read LB 447.) The bill was first read on January 17. It was referred to the Business and Labor Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are Committee amendments by Senator Maresh's Business and Labor Committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Committee amendments by...by whom? Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. Speaker, the Business and Labor Committee amended LB 447 to take out the hundred dollar limit and in its place to say if a disabled person was cared at home by a registered nurse or licensed practical nurse, they shall be compensated at a reasonable cost, and if they were to be taken care of by a nurse's aid, then the cost shall not exceed one hundred dollars. No, pardon me...such amount shall not exceed the amount that a nurse's aid would receive,
