LB 506, 506A

up to a total of twenty-eight thousand, and ten students per year...

SENATOR MARSH: Two minutes left.

SENATOR MARESH: Yes, okay. At no time would there be more than forty loans made. It restricts the loans to schools in the state of Nebraska only, which was the part that was unconstitutional, allowing loans to students out of the state. It does away with the forgiveness which is a one percent loan now, and it also does away with the part that the loans would be made to students from rural areas. We felt this was class legislation, and we feel that the Rural Health Manpower Commission can use their judgment to select students who would be qualified to receive these loans. I better...

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Hefner, there is one minute left before vote must be taken, or it goes to the bottom of the list.

SENATOR HEFNER: Madame President and members of the body, I rise in support of this bill. I want to commend Senator Maresh for bringing this bill up again this year. I understand it was ruled unconstitutional last year, and so therefore, I urge all of you to support this bill.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you. We are now ready and will vote on the advancement of LB 506 as amended.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance.

SENATOR MARSH: LB 506 is advanced. We are now ready for LB 506A.

CLERK: (LB 506A title read.)

SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SENATOR MARESH: Madame...Mr. Speaker, this 506A is a bill to fund this program. I move that this be advanced to E & R Initial.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance 506A to E & R for Review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We're voting the A bill to the bill you just approved. Have you all voted? Record.
