SENATOR NICHOL: I misspoke a little bit ago. I said Clerk of the District Court. What I meant was County Commissioner.

SENATOR KAHLE: Yes, I think that's right. Well, I won't pursue this now, but I want to make sure that we have it in there correct. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp. Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Well, Mr. Speaker, I would only reiterate that I would oppose the adoption of the Committee amendments. There are going to be extensive amendments on this on Select File. I think it's a difficult bill to follow in its argument and in its logic presented through the Committee amendments and through the presentation of two years of hearings on this bill. I think the easiest method to follow would be to reject the Committee amendments, move the bill to Select File and then we can deal with it in its entirety, and then we can take each one of the Committee amendments one by one, compare that with the other amendments that are going to be filed, and I think we can...we're going to have a much better picture of the entire situation. But to adopt the Committee amendments is going to be much more confusing for everyone and take
