LB 187

SENATOR WESELY: I certainly would. I move the E & R amendments to LB 187.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. Okay, the motion, Senator Wesely, is to advance the bill.

SENATOR WESELY: I'd move to advance LB 187 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You have heard the motion. All those in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried and the bill is advanced. Now are there amendments to, Senator Warner, do you have a motion on LB 187?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, sir, to have it replaced on Select File for the specific amendments. Can I take the two together, Mr. Clerk? Can I adopt both of them with one motion? They are just on two different sheets.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, they will be incorporated as one amendment unless there is objections and do you just want to just briefly comment on the two before we take the motion to bring the bill back.

SENATOR WARNER: If you will look on page 962 of the Journal, there is a copy of the one amendment. The other one has been passed out to you this morning. On 962, one through nine and twelve, amendments so numbered, each only make an adjustment, a correction in the conversion from mills to cents. These when they were checking were incorrect. Number 10 makes the operative date January 1, 1981. As the bill was written, it was April 1, 1984. As I explained one other time, that was tied to a bill a year ago and it was just drafted the same way but the Department of Revenue says that this is a date that will fit conveniently for the adjustment of the various forms and would create no cost from that. Amendment number eleven is a corrective language. It makes no change. Section 13 strikes two sections neither of which should be amended. They have mill levies but it does not deal with...or it has mills, rather, but they do not deal with taxation. It is mills related to quantity or something like that but it would be inappropriate for them, and the rest of the amendments on that are only the technical amendments of the reference and the correction of the title to reflect those sections that are being stricken. The other amendment that was passed out to you this morning, the first one is essentially an E & R type amendment. The next two amendments are eliminating obsolete language. In both cases,
