CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Now the motion is on the adoption of the amendments one and two as explained by Senator Warner. Is there any further discussion? All those in favor of adopting the amendments vote aye, opposed vote no. Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the amendments are adopted and, Senator Wesely, do you want to move the bill?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: To rerefer the bill.

SENATOR WESELY: I would like to move to rerefer the bill to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to rerefer LB 187 to E & R for engrossment. All those in favor say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The bill is rereferred. Next bill, LB 196.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are no E & R amendments to LB 196. However, I do have an amendment pending by Senator Warner. Would you like me to read the amendment, Senator? Senator Warner moves to insert a new section: Read. (See page 1036, Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Mr. Clerk, did I sign that with the number Chairman back of it?

CLERK: You signed it as Chairman.

SENATOR WARNER: Okay, Mr. President, this is a committee, Appropriations Committee, amendment to the bill.
