a mortgage. I ask for the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR MARSH: We are now ready and will vote on the adoption of Senator Koch's amendment which is found on pages 898, 899 on through until 901. Those in favor signify by voting yes, opposed no. Senator Marsh voting yes.

CLERK: Senator Marsh voting aye.

SENATOR MARSH: Have you all voted? It takes 25 votes to adopt this amendment. Last call, have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt, Madam President.
