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country or whether you did not, has little to do with your ability to pay and I think it is one thing above all that we should look on this, not necessarily as a money saving device, but as one, and Senator Murphy, I will go with you on almost all the money saving things that you can come but when you send them on and are going to separate two men standing out in front of you and say, one, because you have been in the service you do not have to pay but you who have not, you do have to. Senator Murphy, to me, and you and I may disagree on this, but from the humanitarian's part of it, I am going to oppose your amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch, do you wish to speak to the Murphy amendment?

SENATOR KOCH: A question of Senator Keyes, please.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Keyes, do you yield?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, Jerry.

SENATOR KOCH: Senator Keyes, I have had several calls in the past, particularly the four months or so, from individuals who are totally disabled due to heart attacks. Would you be willing to put them in here as well because of extremely high property taxes, inability to pay those? They are just as disabled in many cases and sometimes more so than the individuals we are trying to identify here in this piece of legislation.

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Koch, if you bring a bill up next year....

SENATOR KOCH: No.

SENATOR KEYES: ...because before the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee or put an amendment on this bill and prove that a man is unable to work and he is in a wheelchair because of a heart attack, I certainly will support it.

SENATOR KOCH: Why not put it on this bill since we are trying to make it an omnibus bill in terms of disability and capabilities of earning....

SENATOR KEYES: Is there a difference between a veteran and a nonveteran who has a heart attack now in the law?
