Mr. President, Senator Keyes offers a corrected Standing Committee report to LB 329. (See page 1043 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: We are ready for LB 414.

CLERK: (Read title to LB 414.) The bill was first read on January 17. It was referred to the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments by Senator Keyes' committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Are there committee amendments? Okay, Senator Keyes, do you want to take the committee amendments to 414?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, I would like to take the committee amendments to LB 414. We seemed to have had one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight bills that came from Ray Johnson and banking, our auditor and Banking Committee. We heard them all one day. We turned around and amended 414 to include LB 110 and I will read you what 110 does. It was introduced by Senator Clark relating to the duties of the Auditor of Public Accounts. LB 295 was a bill that was introduced by the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee at the request of the Auditor of Public Accounts. The bill would allow the auditor to establish a minimum education and experience standards for all auditors of state agencies to assure adequate level of competency and general uniformity of the professional auditing standards. LB 296 is introduced by the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee at the request of the Auditor of Public Accounts. 414 was introduced by the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee.
