SPEAKER MARVEL: Now, Senator DeCamp, you have described the bill. The motion is to the advancement of 334 to E & R for review as amended. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced and the last bill, LB 478, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read title to LB 478.) The bill was first read on January 17. It was referred to the Banking Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, LB 478, Senator Murphy's bill, as stated amends the Nebraska Installment Sales Act to provide for a daily accrual of the time price differential on a simple interest basis. The proposed amendment leaves existing practices and procedures intact but makes certain changes and additions to clearly provide for an optional approach to calculating, computing and charging the time price differential on the installment sales contracts. Now the committee amendment that we are talking about which was unanimously put in there, drops a portion of the new matter relating to an assumption that the unpaid balance be reduced and also it just corrects a typographical error. ....will be handled by Senator Murphy.
