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up and say I am sorry and I made a mistake and we ought to do it differently. So that is what I am doing today and I am eating crow and I don't like the taste of it but I wanted you to know that that is the kind of Senator I hope to be. So I ask for your support of this amendment to get rid of that Wesely amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Schmit, do you wish to be recognized on the Wesely motion?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I just want to commend Senator Wesely. I think he has shown a very remarkable ability to acknowledge an error and I certainly would be wanting to be one of the first to tell him that the more crow you eat the better it tastes and I have had more than my share of it in this body and it has even put a few pounds on, right, Senator Chambers?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Also may I take just a moment to congratulate you, Senator Wesely. It is not easy to do. I have done it and I think everybody else has done it in here, too, and I can even vouch for the Speaker. I know he has had a little problem once in awhile with the crows but you are certainly your man and you are a good legislator and I thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, I just hope that Senator Duis is speaking for himself and not the rest of us. We will make our own statements on omissions of commission or something.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to strike...give me the description, Mr. Clerk...the Wesely amendment on page 850 of the Journal. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Okay, record the vote.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the amendment is stricken. What is the next item?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers now moves to amend and those amendments may be found referenced on page 1022, 1024 of the Journal. You will find them in your bill books I believe though.
