Senator Wesely, excuse me.

SENATOR WESELY: I move that LB 201 be advanced to E & R for Engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye. Opposed no. The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. LB 204.
