SENATOR WESELY: Can I move the E & R amendment first?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Oh, I'm sorry. Go ahead.

SENATOR WESELY: I move the E & R amendment to LB 58.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The E & R amendments are adopted. Senator Koch.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Koch's amendments may be found on Page 996 of the Journal.

SENATOR KOCH: The purpose of this amendment is to clarify costs that may accrue. Senator Warner and I visited. This is an amendment that Senator Warner thought was... could be applicable and I agree. Anyone who falls under the restrictions of this application for license would pay those fees which may be incurred because of an audit to determine whether or not the license is indeed being carried out under the provisions of the law, and I'm certain that those businesses that will be receiving a license under the terms of 58 will be more than happy to carry out the extent of any costs, because in most cases those books are audited, the CPA has approved them, and so it would be a matter of providing information to the state and to the Control Commission, and I am certain they will not feel that this is an undue burden. I ask for the adoption of the amendment. This should cut down any fiscal concerns that some people might have.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Koch amendment to LB 58. All those...Senator Merz, do you wish to...oh...all those in favor of that motion vote aye. Opposed no. The Koch amendment to LB 58. Have you all voted? We've got about 25 minutes to try to keep 25 people around so that we can adopt the amendments and try to advance some bills.
