Reutzel. Shall we proceed with the vote on the four amendments? Otherwise we recess until one-thirty and it is practically two o'clock before...

SENATOR REUTZEL: It is fine with me.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, we will attempt to vote, and if we get into difficulty, we will have to recess. The motion is on the amendments to LB 234. You have a sheet in front of you. We vote on the first amendment which is to strike the standing committee amendments. All those in favor of that vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is the adoption of the first Reutzel-Landis amendment to LB 234. Have you all voted? Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: How many are excused, Mr. Speaker?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Four excused? Who is it? Okay, there are four excused, Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: I am going to have to ask for a Call of the House, I guess.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, clear the Board. A Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor of putting the House under Call vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take their seats. Record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. All legislators, since we are approaching noon, will you please record your presence as rapidly as possible. We will accept call ins.

CLERK: Senator Brennan voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Legislators, please take your seats. The Chair will stop the Call unless you take your seats.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no. Senator Vickers voting no. Senator Stoney voting no. Senator Sieck voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Labeledz, we are voting on the first amendment, Reutzel-Landis amendment, to LB 234.

CLERK: Senator Labeledz voting aye. Senator Haberman voting no.
