LB 42, 58, 101A, 344,
356, 543, 555, 557

Mr. President, Senator Marsh asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 42, Senator Kelly to LB 58, Senator Wesely to LB 344. (See pages 1092-1093 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, your committee on Appropriations will meet at twelve noon immediately upon adjournment tomorrow in Room 1003.

Mr. President, a new bill, 101A introduced by Senator Labedz. (Read LB 101A as found on page 1093 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, your committee on Appropriations whose chairman is Senator Warner to whom is referred LB 543 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation it be advanced to General File; 555 General File; 557 advanced to General File, signed, Senator Warner, Chairman.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, 356.

CLERK: (Read title to LB 356.) The bill was first read on January 16. It was referred to the Urban Affairs Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator George, do you wish to speak to the committee amendments?

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the committee amendments. The committee amendments basically put a limit on the amount of personal property where there is no estimate of cost necessary and that limit is \$10,000. I move the adoption of the committee amendments.
