SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I'm not going to ask for a Call of the House, just have a discussion. You said this was the last bill. The next bill I want to go back to committee. We have to have a hearing on it and if we could just process that today then we could set up the hearing.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all voted? Do you want to make a motion on the...? Have you all voted on the adoption of the committee amendments to 278? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The committee amendments are adopted. Now the motion is to advance the bill as amended to E & R for review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the advancement of the bill as amended. Have you all voted? We are voting on the advancement of the bill as amended. The bill number is 278. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the bill is advanced. Now do you want to make a motion on the next bill, Senator DeCamp?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I would move to return the bill to committee. Senator Fitzgerald, Senator Stoney both have some major concerns. So do some other groups in the state. Let me just say briefly so that everybody knows what 312 with the amendment that we are talking about does. 312 is the one that would allow the extended warranties of GM, Ford, whoever it is to use. Apparently it is a very major bill. It came to us too late to introduce it in the routine so we used another bill. It apparently has some other implications and I think it is only fair to have a public hearing on it so I make that motion. If Senator Stoney or Senator Fitzgerald want to comment further, fine.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp, do you want to sign this motion? Senator Fitzgerald, while Senator DeCamp is signing the motion, do you wish to speak?
