I just want to know what we're going to do if we're going to take the railroad people out from the responsibility of it. Alright, Senator DeCamp, I'll ask you another question. If we're going to put in arms, you know, we'll have to go a thousand feet, seventeen hundred feet down the rail to put in the thing that turns them on and off...

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes.

SENATOR KEYES: ...now is the railroad going to give us permission to go in and do that, or do we have to seek permission from the railroad, knowing that they're going to have to maintain it? Who's going to put it in...the railroad...my county don't have any of those, the railroad has them, has those controls.

SENATOR DeCAMP: That is not a problem as I understand it.

SENATOR KEYES: It isn't?

SENATOR DeCAMP: That has never been a problem. The problem isn't that. The problem is, I repeat, for Senator Newell's benefit...

SENATOR KEYES: You've got my consent.

SENATOR DeCAMP: You can say all you want about they should do this, and by golly it's their responsibility, and so on and so forth, you don't have power to order somebody to pay for something. You have power to tax. You have certain other powers, and that's the weakness of this whole system. It has to be a voluntary thing on their part and they haven't been doing it.

SENATOR KEYES: Well I wonder sometimes whether it's voluntary on their part. They have certain things that they have to follow and they do. I'm going to...I don't support you on taking the railroads completely out of the responsibility of paying for it. That don't sound exactly like that would get the job done any better, but I would like to know just exactly what all is included in it because in northeast Sarpy County, I'd like to get one up there, a controlled access. I haven't been able to do that one yet, although some of them we did get and we got them pretty... rather easily. So I guess I don't even know what you... really what we're talking about here when you talk about
