CLERK: 24 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Did you get Chambers' vote?

CLERK: I got Senator Chambers' vote.

PRESIDENT: Alright, that's the last one.

SENATOR SIMON: Mr. President. Mr. President, you recognized...

PRESIDENT: Senator Simon, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR SIMON: Well I wish to object...Senator Cullan, you did recognize Senator Cullan. I know that you called him.

PRESIDENT: That's correct.

SENATOR SIMON: The Clerk did not record Senator Cullan's vote.

PRESIDENT: Well I believe Senator Cullan's vote was recorded.

SENATOR SIMON: No, sir, it was not.

PRESIDENT: Well he was...I recognized Senator Cullan before I did Senator Chambers.

SENATOR SIMON: That's correct, but the Clerk did not record his vote and that is the 25th vote.

PRESIDENT: I did. I did. Well the Chair will rule that I had recognized Senator Cullan before I recognized Senator Chambers, and in fact I don't believe Senator Chambers would have changed his vote had I not done so. So that's the reason I...then Senator Chambers and I said that was the last one I was going to take. Senator Cullan I believe voted...Senator Cullan will you correct...you voted aye. I announced it. There will be no more changes. Those are the only two that I recognized and I asked for the vote to be recorded. That vote will now be announced. He's totaling it up.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries and the amendment is adopted.
