Now, what is the status? Are there any further amendments on the desk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, Senator DeCamp now moves to amend. Would you like me to read them, Senator?

PRESIDENT: Read it. Speaker Marvel, do you wish to continue with...how many more amendments do we have? Senator Marvel, what do you wish to do?

SPEAKER MARVEL: I'll yield to another amendment.

PRESIDENT: Alright, one more amendment. Mr. Clerk, do you have the amendment?

CLERK: I have an amendment offered by Senator DeCamp. Would you like me to read it, Mr. President?

PRESIDENT: Yes, read the amendment.

CLERK: (Read DeCamp amendment as found on Page 1109 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President it's my understanding from Senator Nichol and the Judiciary Committee that this is just a necessary technical correction and they were brought to our attention by Mr. Dunlevy, the whatever he's called, what is he called...I mean Court Administrator, and the purpose is to retain existing procedures by which the Jury Commissioner provides the key number to the Election Commissioner, or County Clerk, who then delivers the certified list of prospective jurors to the Jury Commissioner. This is the most efficient procedure that the voter registration lists as the sole list to be used for selection of jurors as provided by the Committee amendments, striking the provisions for also using driver license lists. I have discussed this with several Clerks of the District Court and they all agree that the existing procedure which these amendments will retain is best if only the voter registration list is to be used...blah, blah. It's, as I understand necessary, is that right? So I move adoption.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Senator Newell, for what...do you wish to speak to the...alright. The question then is the adoption of the DeCamp amendment to LB 234. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.
