SPEAKER MARVEL: It is Request #888. All those in favor of the introduction of a bill by the Appropriations Committee as explained by Senator Warner vote aye, opposed vote no. Clerk, record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the introduction of the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion carried.

CLERK: New bill, Mr. President, LB 583. Read title. (See page 1129, Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner, you have Request #890 now?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the Request #890 which is passed out I did not take time to initial is a bill proposing to amend existing law which was enacted probably fifteen, eighteen years ago which authorized state appropriations to certain counties or certain areas, actually, that had a high percentage of valuation of their property in reservations thus reducing the availability for, primarily, for some law enforcement. This appropriation has been made at around \$113,000 for sometime but the way the law reads it is to be thirty mills times the assessed value. The counties having reassessed, this now comes out at about \$186,000 and it is much more than is needed and the introduction of this bill will merely reflect what is needed. What the bill says that it authorizes appropriations up to \$113,000 and some odd dollars for this purpose annually and this will enable the Legislature to maintain the program but be in compliance with what the statute states should be appropriated. I move the bill's introduction.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You have heard the motion. All those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? This is request #3 by the Appropriations Committee for the introduction of a bill. Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion carried.
