

want to talk about some of the problems that you are going to have to resolve one way or another. Now the Southern Conference has done this for years, probably had the most effective utilization of the facilities in that area as any place I know in the country, veterinary medicine slots, optometry slots, reciprocal agreements. One of the real problems that brought about this issue and we met right in Senator Murphy's home district in Wayne a year and a half ago to talk about reciprocal agreements between Iowa and Nebraska. Wayne, Nebraska has got a fine four year school. You'd be surprised to know a number of them are out of states and we ought to maybe address that so no out of state student can come into this place but we met up there for the purpose of saying, look, we have got the facility. Now let's try to develop some kind of cooperation so that those students that live in the western part of Iowa can go to school in Nebraska. The same thing is true in Peru. The same thing is true in Chadron. In the midwest we are so geographically located that we have institutions that are next to students but the students do not live in that particular state and it makes good sense, it makes good sense to develop some kind of relationships with other states to provide that service. Vet medicine and other highly expensive, low incident areas have to be addressed. We have some problems in a lot of areas, podiatry. Someone has suggested that we need to build a podiatry school in Nebraska. We can't build a podiatry school. Somebody suggested we need a school in terms of optometry. We can't build a school. There are about twenty or thirty or forty or fifty or sixty major areas like this that we are going to have to develop some way to get that job done. Vet medicine, everybody agrees that we cannot build a vet medicine school by ourselves and justify it. I don't suppose everybody agrees to that but everybody with one or two exceptions would have to agree to that.
